

Two Peas in a Pod

o be two peas in a pod describes a relationship so harmonious that it feels as if two people were made for each other. In love, it celebrates compatibility and shared understanding, where partners find joy in their similarities and a perfect rhythm in their connection.

The idiom, first used in the 16th century, conjures the image of peas nestled together in a pod—distinct yet inseparable. Similar but distinct are complementary pairs, opposite that complement each other: *yin and yang, salt and pepper, peanut butter and jelly.* Some of these opposites are united in a successful couple.

Related expressions like *fit like a glove* and *meant to be* also highlight the ease and satisfaction of such deep harmony of a perfect pair who are made for each other.
